

VISA A FOR TRANSIT

A transit visa (visa A) is **only** necessary for the nationalities listed below, in case they are in the **international transit zone** and wait on a connecting flight:

**AFGHANISTAN, BANGLADESH, DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC CONGO, ERITREA, ETHIOPIA,
GHANA, IRAN, IRAK, NIGERIA, PAKISTAN, SOMALIA, SRI LANKA**

In case you have one of the nationalities listed above and you will transit through *Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxemburg, Denmark, Sweden or Norway*, please send us a detailed email, mentioning your place of residence, your nationality and including your full flight itinerary.

VISA C FOR TRANSIT WITH ENTRY

Always verify with your airline if you will need to leave the international transit zone at the airport to check in for your onward flight.

If you will need to leave the international transit zone to check in for your onward flight, which implies you will collect your luggage and then check in again, this is considered an **entry** into the Schengen zone and, as a Jamaican, you will need a **visa C** (short stay), regardless how long (or short) you will leave the transit zone.

So even if you only leave the transit zone to check in for your onward flight, without leaving the airport, you will need to apply for a visa C (short stay). Please refer to the checklist for a visa for tourism to prepare your documents.

If you are checked in already for your onward flight, which implies you will stay in the **transit zone** (luggage is checked through), you will, as a Jamaican, **not** need a visa.
